- ► Evidence-based, original, relevant, on-going research projects that you think can help improve healthcare and social welfare in your local communities in the last two years



What does the author need to know?

- ► All authors must approve the abstract before submission to the EasyChair application.
- ► An author can only submit a maximum of two abstracts of any type.
- ▶ The presenting author is responsible for his/her own funding and arrangements for travel, accommodation, registration, and any conference-related expenses.
